Teacher Explores AIDS Epidemic In Vietnam

Documentary to Premiere Sunday, May 9 at 10 PM on the Global Voices Series on PBS WORLD Channel

(San Francisco, CA)— For the past 15 years, Nguyen Van Hung, once a homeless drug addict, has dedicated his life to helping street children survive AIDS in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. *Teacher*, a documentary film by Leslie Wiener, is the story of his fight against an epidemic that claims its victims by the millions, and of the innocent children and teenagers trapped in a global nightmare. *Teacher* will have its U.S. broadcast premiere on Sunday, May 9, 2010 at 10 PM on *Global Voices*, a new series produced by ITVS International and airing on the PBS WORLD digital channel (check local listings). *Teacher* can also be watched online for the first seven days after broadcast on PBS Video (http://video.pbs.org/).

Teacher revolves around the frenzied yet passionate life of 54-year-old Nguyen Van Hung, better known to the street children as "the professor." The camera follows Van Hung, founder of the SMILE Group for children affected by AIDS, in his round-the-clock struggle to put meaning and hope back into their young lives. From weddings to funerals, maternity to palliative wards, Hung races against time. He wins, he loses, but he never stops running.

Director Leslie Wiener provides insight into a world problem on a very human scale. *Teacher* is the riveting story of a human being fighting an epidemic, a threat to humanity that most of us in the West like to believe has been conquered.

About the Filmmaker

Born in New York City in 1951, Leslie Wiener completed a master's degree in communications and documentary filmmaking before moving to France in 1983. Wiener's passion for Vietnam was ignited in the 1960's when, as an adolescent, she actively participated in the anti-war movement. Her first visit to Vietnam in 1994 reconfirmed that passion. She has since made five documentary films in Vietnam ranging from the *Lonely Planet Travel Film* (Globetrekkers on PBS) to *Children of Peace*, a series of films on the rapid economic development seen through the eyes of 10 children in different regions throughout Vietnam.

Her most recent documentary is a feature-length film for French Television entitled *A Case Against Agent Orange*. The film tells the story of an ongoing lawsuit in American courts brought against all-powerful chemical companies such as Monsanto and Dow Chemical by the Vietnamese Victims of Agent Orange, a group who accuse the companies of war crimes and crimes against humanity. The film follows the American and Vietnamese lawyers as they work together to develop their strategy to condemn the chemical companies. Shooting for the film took place in the United States, France, and Vietnam.

Global Voices is produced by ITVS International and began airing on the PBS WORLD digital channel on Sunday, April 26, 2009 at 10 PM. This 26-week series brings an internationally themed documentaries made by U.S.-based and international filmmakers to a national audience.
