GLOBAL VOICES CELEBRATES INDEPENDENCE DAY IN JULY WITH DOCS OFFERING AN INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE ON INDEPENDENCE

Four Documentaries Examine the Efforts and Struggles Around the World as People and Organizations Strive for Democracy, Independence, and Freedom

(San Francisco, CA, June 16, 2011)— In honor of Independence Day this July 4, 2011, <u>Global Voices</u> and the <u>WORLD</u> Channel present four international documentaries throughout the month of July that focus on the different, difficult actions people and organizations have taken in the fight for independence. The month begins with <u>Storm of Emotions</u>, chronicling the Israeli disengagement from the Gaza Strip and the efforts to achieve democracy amidst great social and political turmoil. July continues with the two-part documentary <u>Cuba</u>, <u>An African Odyssey</u>, showcasing the previously untold story of Cuba's support for African revolutions. <u>The Mosquito Problem & Other Stories</u> follows and focuses on one village as it is continuously transformed by ideologies, regimes, and dreams of economic prosperity. The month concludes with <u>The Siege</u>, a documentary about a historic event in 1996 when the Peruvian Tupac Amaru Revolutionary Movement seized the Japanese ambassador's residence in Lima and held dozens of foreign diplomats hostage for 126 days. All four documentaries will be broadcast on Sunday nights at 10 PM on the <u>WORLD</u> Channel. Sunday, July 3 – Storm of Emotions

When Israel completed its withdrawal from the Sinai desert in 1982 following a peace agreement with Egypt, many people chose Gush Katif, a bloc of Israeli settlements in the Gaza Strip, as their new home. But when the Israeli government ordered the evacuation of Gaza in August 2005 as part of its disengagement plan, the decision resulted in massive political and social turmoil. <u>Storm of Emotions</u> documents the historic moment of this evacuation, one of the most complex and provocative missions ever undertaken by Israel's police forces.

Sunday, July 10 and July 17 - Cuba, An African Odyssey (Part I and II)

From Che Guevara's military campaign to avenge Lumumba in the Congo to the fall of apartheid in South Africa, 300,000 Cubans have fought alongside African revolutionaries. <u>*Cuba, An African Odyssey*</u> is the previously untold story of Cuba's support for African revolutions, one of the Cold War's most vigorous contests over resources and ideology.



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Sunday, July 24 – The Mosquito Problem & Other Stories

<u>The Mosquito Problem & Other Stories</u> is the tale of a of a village turned concentration camp, turned city, turned nuclear power plant. In a world instantly transformed by ideologies, regimes, and dreams of economic prosperity, characters' lives intersect in a sinister past and nuclear future.

Sunday, July 31 – The Siege

The Siege is a powerful documentary about the infamous 1996 siege in Lima. The Tupac Amaru Revolutionary Movement (MRTA), lead by Nestor Cerpa, storms a party at the Japanese Ambassador's residence, taking hundreds of hostages and demanding the release of MRTA members from prison, including Cerpa's wife. President Alberto Fujimori's response is uncompromising and fatal. With unprecedented access to archival footage, police recordings, and key interviews, the film documents four extraordinary months as the siege builds to an astonishing conclusion.
