(San Francisco, CA) — Independent Lens Executive Producer Lois Vossen has been named the Chairperson for Documentaries for the Magnolia Awards, the world's leading international TV competition, bestowed by the Shanghai TV Festival in China. The 22nd Shanghai TV Festival will take place from June 6-10, 2016. Magnolia Awards are given in four categories: drama, documentaries, animation and variety shows. Other jurors include renowned Chinese actor Zhang Guoli and Serbian screenwriter and critic Bozidar Zecevic.

"I'm honored to have been selected to be the documentary chairperson for the Festival's Magnolia Awards," said Lois Vossen. "*Independent Lens* has a long tradition of presenting international documentaries and I'm looking

forward to seeing new work of filmmakers from around the world. This will also be a unique opportunity to meet with my international colleagues — producers, executives, curators and others — who are dedicated to taking television to the next level."

As executive producer of *Independent Lens*, Vossen is responsible for commissioning new work, curating the series, and working closely with ITVS and *Independent Lens*-funded filmmakers to provide creative feedback and editorial support related to broadcast standards. *Independent Lens* films have received ten News & Documentary Emmy Awards, two Primetime Emmys, 15 George Foster Peabody Awards, five Alfred I. duPont-Columbia Journalism Awards, and seven Academy Award nominations, and is the 2015 winner of the IDA Award for Best Continuing Series — its third consecutive win. Previously, Vossen was Associate Managing Director of the Sundance Film Festival and Sundance Labs. She serves on the Documentary Peer Panel for the Television Academy, and has been a juror at SXSW, DOC New Zealand, Toronto International, New Orleans, and Palm Springs International film festivals, among others.
