FOUR ITVS PROGRAMS RECEIVE NOMINATIONS FOR THE 30TH ANNUAL NEWS AND DOCUMENTARY EMMY® AWARDS

Two ITVS International Programs Are Among the Nominations

Winners to Be Announced on September 21 at Frederick P. Rose Hall, Home of Jazz at Lincoln Center

(San Francisco, CA)—Independent Television Service (ITVS) announced today that four of its acclaimed films received nominations for the 30th annual News and Documentary Emmy® Awards. The awards recognize outstanding achievement in broadcast journalism during the 2008 calendar year. Since 1997, ITVS programs have garnered 13 wins in the News and Documentary category.

Among the four ITVS programs nominated are two ITVS International productions, **DOPING FOR GOLD** and the **BELARUSIAN WALTZ**. **DOPING FOR GOLD**, directed and produced by Alison Rooper, is nominated in the Outstanding Science, Technology and Nature Programming category. Set in Cold War–era East Germany, **DOPING FOR GOLD** reveals how young female athletes were injected with male hormones and anabolic steroids—all in the name of "international prestige through success in sports." The film is a Firefly Production for Thirteen/WNET New York and ITVS International in association with Five, Channel Four International and History Channel (UK). **DOPING FOR GOLD** premiered on PBS's *Secrets of the Dead* series on May 7, 2008.

The ITVS International program **BELARUSIAN WALTZ** received a nomination in the Outstanding Historical Programming – Long Form category. Directed by Andrjez Fidyk, **BELARUSIAN WALTZ** is the story of Alexander Pushkin, a performance artist who used his "patriotic" art to protest against his country's dictatorship. The film is a co-production of Piraya Film, ITVS International, MG Productions and Arte and premiered on PBS's *P.O.V*. series on August 12, 2008.

Additional nominations went to ITVS-funded programs **IN THE FAMILY**, produced by Joanna Rudnick and Gordon Quinn, and **THE JUDGE AND THE GENERAL**, produced by Elizabeth Farnsworth. Both premiered on the *P.O.V*. series in 2008.
